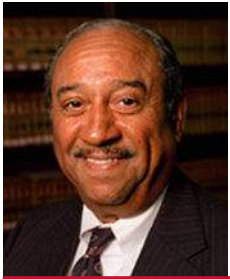

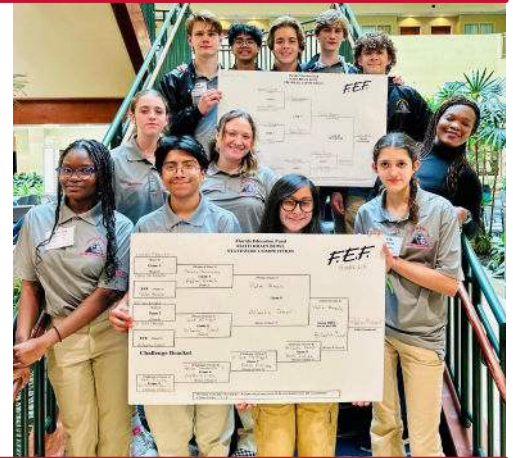

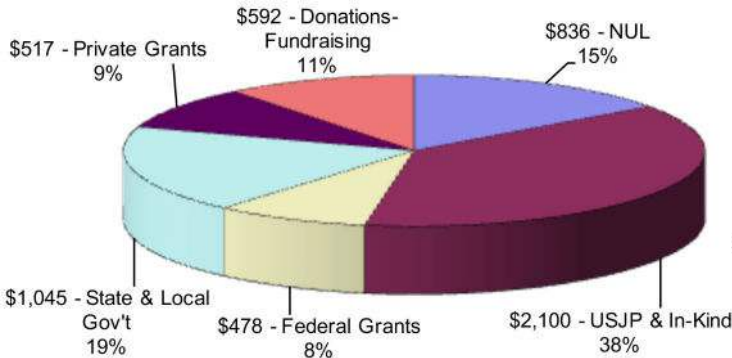
John W. Mack Medal of Honor

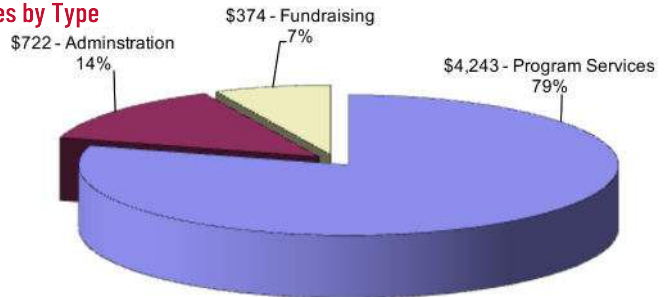


Financial Outlook

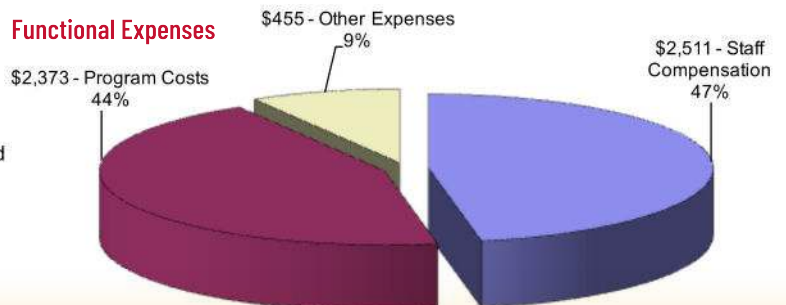
Revenue Sources
